## **Hand Hygiene**

- ✓ NS Health has a <u>Hand Hygiene Policy</u> which outlines our hand hygiene principles and proper hand hygiene practices. Do you know your four moments of hand hygiene?
- ✓ NS Health provides hand hygiene education to staff, service providers, and volunteers at orientation, as well as at regular intervals using a variety of educational opportunities.
- ✓ NS Health measures hand hygiene compliance by regularly auditing (direct observation) to ensure proper practices are maintained and to identify where improvements need to be made.
- ✓ Hand hygiene compliance rates are shared on a quarterly basis with staff, learners and volunteers. Do you know where to find hand hygiene compliance rates for your unit/facility? Posting the rates on your unit will help encourage awareness for staff, physicians, patients and families!
- ✓ NS Health is required to publicly report hand hygiene compliance by zone on a quarterly basis to the public and Department of Health and Wellness according to the Patient Safety Act. This information can be found at: Public Reporting on Patient Safety
